MPL Welcomes New Board for 2023-2027 Term

Milton Public Library is pleased to welcome its new Board members after being appointed by the Milton Town Council last fall. They were officially sworn in for the 2023-2027 term.

The new Library Board, with a diverse mix of experiences, skills, backgrounds and perspectives, consists of three Town Councillors – **Sarah Marshall, Colin Best and Rick Malbeouf** who have each served on the Board previously – and four volunteer community members, **Sana Malik, Sibyl Shen, Ragy Sharkawy** and **Karen Wolnik**. Malik and Shen were elected by the Board at its first meeting as Chair and Vice-Chair, respectively.

Library Board members are essential in providing governance and financial oversight for the library. The board meets seven times annually and is a formal policy-setting group that exists to set goals and objectives to meet the community's public library needs. Board meetings are typically held on the third Wednesday of the month, in the months of January, March, May, June, September, October and November, and are open to the community.

Library Boards are established according to the Ontario Public Libraries Act, and are tasked with fiduciary, short and long term planning and policy development. The Board delegates the appropriate authority to staff, through the CEO/Chief Librarian, to run the library system and achieve the planning and financial goals. They are ultimately accountable to Milton Town Council for the operations of the Library.

The Milton Public Library has been an integral part of the Milton community since 1855. It currently serves a population of more than 130,000 through three busy branch locations and an active website – beinspired.ca.

Sana Malik (Chair):

Councillor Sarah Marshall:


