





Now in its eleventh year, One Book, One Milton continues to be Milton Public Library's signature annual program having played host to some of Canada's greatest icons. MPL is honoured to added Waubgeshig Rice and his novel *Moon of the Turning Leaves* to this incredible list.







About Waubgeshig Rice

Waubgeshig Rice is an author and journalist from Wasauksing First Nation. He graduated from the journalism program at Toronto Metropolitan University in 2002, and spent most of his journalism career with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation as a video journalist and radio host. He left CBC in 2020 to focus on his literary career.

In addition to his writing endeavours, Waubgeshig is an eclectic public speaker, delivering keynote addresses and workshops, engaging in interviews, and contributing to various panels at literary festivals and conferences. He speaks on creative writing and oral storytelling, contemporary Anishinaabe culture and matters, Indigenous representation in arts and media, and more.

He lives in Sudbury, Ontario with his wife and three sons.

A draft report will be completed by early fall, followed by community consultation and stakeholder engagement, with the final plan expected to be endorsed by the MPL Board in November 2024.

New Horizons for Seniors 2024

The Milton Public Library has received the New Horizon for Seniors Grant 2024 for their project "Engaging Senior Artists," building on their previous successful initiatives. This grant aims to empower senior citizens through visual arts. The "Engaging Senior Artists" project will offer workshops, artist talks, and exhibitions, fostering community connections and reducing social isolation among seniors while promoting lifelong learning and a sense of belonging.
